A youth network aiming at strengthening the European Integration in the Danube Area

The Young Citizens Danube Network was founded in July 2010 as part of the European Union Strategy for Danube Region (EUSDR) with the aim of bringing young people together to exchange experience and ideas and to give them opportunity to participate in shaping the region's and their own future.

The Network is organizing a conference at Budapest's Andrassy University in June, 2011. The conference titled "The Young Generation of the Danube Area as a Key to European Integration" is a three day conference expected to gather approximately 50 young Danubians who will be given opportunity to partake in interdisciplinary workshops and discuss challenges of the Danube region.

The Conference aims to provoke a dialogue among young people coming from all 14 countries of the Danube region (Austria, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Czech Republic, Germany, Hungary, Moldova, Montenegro, Romania, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia and Ukraine). Through dialogue YCDN wants to enable young generation to successfully learn from each other and share and expand their views of the regional cooperation and youth. The Young Citizens Danube Network is hoping to use the June conference to establish a successful and lasting youth network.

Through four workshops, conference participants will have opportunity to discuss existing stereotypes and prejudice in the region, consequences of the financial crisis, environmental issues in the catchment area of the Danube River and issues related to the trafficking in human beings.
